## PROCEDURE SIGNALS (from BS Handbook 10th edition)

Used by Sender (Letters with line over them are sent as one letter.)

MORSE	MEANING	EXPLANATION
AAAA	Attention	I have a message for you. Are you ready?
8 E's	Errors	I made a mistake. I will repeat beginning with last word that I send correctly
Pause	End of word	End of word. More coming.
AAA	Period	End of sentence. More coming. (Punctuation is usually spelled out in long messages.)
AR	End of message	That's all for now. Did you get it?

Used by Receiver (Letters with line over them are sent as one letter.)

MORSE	MEANING	EXPLANATION
K	Go ahead	I am ready to receive. Start sending.
IMI	Repeat sign	Please send again; I missed it.
T	Word received	I understood word. (To be send upon receipt of each word; not used in telegraph and radio receiving.)
R	Message received	I got it OK.
