Eighteen will develop hobbies used during their adult life.

Eight will enter a vocation that was learned through the badge or patch program.

Seventeen will be future Girl Scout volunteers.

One will use her Girl Scouting skills to save a life.

One will use her Girl Scouting skills to save her own life.

The Girl Scout Sign: The right hand is raised shoulder high with the three middle fingers extended and the thumb crossing over the palm to hold down the little finger. These 3 fingers represent the three parts of the Girl Scout Promise. You give the sign when:

- You say the Promise
- You are welcomed into Girl Scouting at an investiture ceremony
- You greet other Girl Scouts and Girl Guides.

The Quiet Sign: This is used in meetings and other gatherings to let people know it is time to stop talking. The sign is made by raising your right hand high. As people in the group see the quiet sign, they stop talking and also raise their hands. Once everyone is silent, the meeting continues.

The Girl Scout Handshake: This is a formal way of greeting other Girl Scouts and Girl Guides. You shake hands with the left hand and give the Girl Scout sign with your right hand. The left handed handshake represents friendship because the left hand is closer to the heart.

Troop Government: We divide members into small groups called Patrol. Patrols choose patrol name, patrol slogan, patrol leaders, and assistant patrol leaders. A kaper chart lists jobs and who does them. Members of the patrol should rotate the leadership jobs so that everyone has an opportunity.

The World Trefoil Pin: The international symbol of Girl Scouting. The three trefoil leaves represent the three parts of the [promise](#): “To serve God and my country, to help people at all times, and to live by the Girl Scout Law.” Your World Trefoil Pin shows that you are a part of this global organization.

The Birthday of Girl Scouting in the United States of America is **March 12**. It marked the day in 1912 when Juliette Gordon Low officially registered the organization’s first 18 girl members in Savannah, Georgia.

Low, Juliette Gordon (nicknamed Daisy): Founder of Girl Scout of USA was born on October 31, 1860.

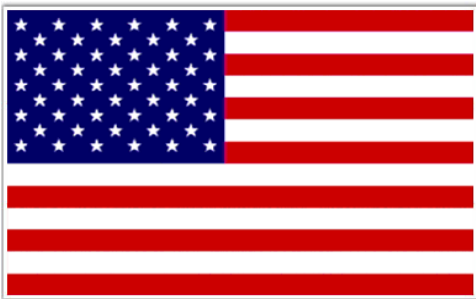
World Thinking Day: Celebrated by Girl Guides and Girl Scouts throughout the world, February 22 is the birthday of Lord Baden-Powell and lady Baden-Powell. This is the day for Girl Scouts and Girl Guides to think about their sisters around the world, through special projects, international program activities or pen pal projects.

World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS): An international educational association for girls with a membership of eight million.

The World Centers: WAGGGS has four world centers. The Cabana is in Cuernavaca, Mexico; the Chalet is in Adelboden, Switzerland; Pax Lodge is at the Olave Center in London, England; and Sangam is in Pune, India.

Color-in the United States of America Flag

The American flag was adopted in 1777 and originally called The Stars and Stripes. Over the years, tradition has given meaning to the colors.

RED is for hardiness and valour

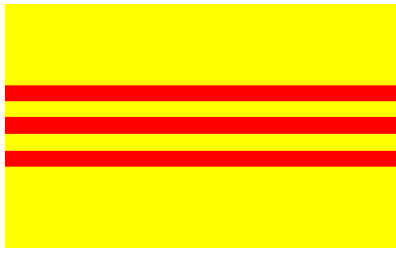
WHITE is for purity and innocence

BLUE is for vigilance, perseverance and justice

The US Code declares that a flag displayed horizontally or vertically against a wall should show the Union (the blue portion) at the top and to the viewers left.

Also this from a book about the flag published in 1977 by the House of Representatives...

"The star is a symbol of the heavens and the divine goal to which man has aspired from time immemorial; the stripe is symbolic of the rays of light emanating from the sun."



LÁ CỜ VIỆT NAM –

The National Flag of Free Vietnam has yellow background and three horizontal red bands in the middle of the flag.

The Meaning of National Flag of Free Vietnam

The yellow background represents the ancestral land and the skin color of Vietnamese race. The yellow color also represents earth (one of five elements - metal, wood, water, fire, and earth) symbolizing the territory and the national sovereignty.

The red color represents fire (one of five elements mentioned above). The red color is also the color of the South and symbolizes a brave, un-submissive, heroic, and independent race in the south region.

The three red bands represent the three regions of Vietnam: North, Central, and South. But, these three regions unite in the national home, the home of Vietnamese people, who always love and protect one another.

Cadette Girl Scout Awards

Bridge to Senior Girl Scouts Award

Upon the arrival of your 9th grade, you need to complete 2 activities for this award to prepare for the Senior level Girl Scouting.

Cadette Community Service Bar

Community service bars stand for completion of training by a community service organization and 20 hours of service. There are two steps involved in earning this award:

1. Select an organization in which you would like to work. They must train you for a minimum of four hours. Your Council must approve of both the organization and the training they propose.
2. Commit to and do a minimum of 20 hours of service to the organization.

Cadette Service to Girl Scouting Bar

Volunteer at least 20 hours to the Girl Scout organization, such as volunteer your time at a special event for younger girls, be an office assistant for your council or service unit, or help with special projects.

The Silver Torch Award

Two steps to earn this award:

1. Complete one Cadette Leadership Journey.
2. Serve 1 full term in a leadership position at your school, place of worship, library, ...

The length of your service will depend on the term specified by the organization or the particular role.

Cadette Program Aide

To earn this award, you need to *earn 1 LiA award, complete council designed leadership course training, and work directly with younger girls over six activity sessions.

Girl Scout Silver Award

The highest award a Girl Scout Cadette can earn—gives you the chance to show that you are a leader who is organized, determined, and dedicated to improving your community. Earning the award puts you among an exceptional group of girls who have used their knowledge and leadership skills to make a difference in the world.

On this amazing maze of a journey, each passageway presents opportunities for Cadettes to navigate personal relationships in the best and most productive ways. If you complete all 3 Cadette Journeys, you'll earn the Cadette Journey Summit award.

My Promise, My Faith

Earning this award helps you explore how Girl Scouting and your faith offer similar ideas about how to act – and how Girl Scouting can tie into your faith. You can earn this pin once a year, every year you are in Girl Scouts. Just choose a different line of the Law each year.

Religious awards are created by the various religious groups to encourage girls to grow stronger in their faith. Girl Scouts recognizes these programs and allows the recognition to be worn on the official uniform.

My Promise, My Faith

1. **Choose one line from the Girl Scout Law.** Find a story, song, or poem from your faith with the same ideas. Talk with your family or friends about what that line of the Law and the story, song, or poem have in common.
2. **Find a woman in your own or another faith community.** Ask her how she tries to use that line of the Law in her life.
3. **Gather three inspirational quotes** by women that fit with that line of the Girl Scout Law. Put them where you can see them every day!
4. **Make something to remind you of what you've learned.** It might be a drawing, painting, or poster. You could also make up a story or a kit.
5. **Keep the connection strong.** Talk with your friends, family, or a group in your faith community about what you've learned about your faith and Girl Scouting. Ask them to help you live the Law and your faith. May be you can show them what you just made or perform your skit!
