Daisy neckerchief color and its meaning:

Light green – considerate and caring

The Girl Scout Sign: The right hand is raised shoulder high with the three middle fingers extended and the thumb crossing over the palm to hold down the little finger. These 3 fingers represent the three parts of the Girl Scout Promise. You give the sign when:

- You say the Promise
- You are welcomed into Girl Scouting at an investiture ceremony
- You greet other Girl Scouts and Girl Guides.

The Quiet Sign: This is used in meetings and other gatherings to let people know it is time to stop talking. The sign is made by raising your right hand high. As people in the group see the quiet sign, they stop talking and also raise their hands. Once everyone is silent, the meeting continues.

The Girl Scout Handshake: This is a formal way of greeting other Girl Scouts and Girl Guides. You shake hands with the left hand and give the Girl Scout sign with your right hand. The left handed handshake represents friendship because the left hand is closer to the heart.

The Birthday of Girl Scouting in the United States of America is **March 12**. It marked the day in 1912 when Juliette Gordon Low officially registered the organization's first 18 girl members in Savannah, Georgia.

Juliette (Daisy) Gordon Low: Founder of Girl Scout of USA was born on October 31, 1860.

World Thinking Day: Celebrated by Girl Guides and Girl Scouts throughout the world, February 22 is the birthday of Lord Baden-Powell and lady Baden-Powell. This is the day for Girl Scouts and Girl Guides to think about their sisters around the world, through special projects, international program activities or pen pal projects.

World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS): An international educational association for girls with a membership of eight million.

The World Trefoil Pin: The international symbol of Girl Scouting.



The **yellow trefoil on the blue background** represents the sun shining over all of us, all over the world from a blue sky.

The **three trefoil leaves** represent the three parts of the Promise.

The **two stars** represent the Promise and Law.

The **needle** represents a compass needle showing us the way.

The **flame** towards the bottom of the trefoil represents the flame of the love of humanity.

The **outer circle** represents our world-wide Association.

During her years as a Daisy, every Girl should have the opportunity to

- Learn the Girl Scout way - Girl Scout Promise, Girl Scout Laws, and know the quiet sign.
- Explore the meaning of Citizenship by learning about our flag, participate in a flag ceremony, and learn ways to respect the rights of others.
- Learn new skills and experiences by taking a short fieldtrip and receive recognition for accomplishments.
- Explore the outdoors by taking a short hike and learn the “leave no trace”, especially practice the buddy system at all times.
- Express her creativity by make something for herself and others; have a song or game as part of each meeting.

The American flag was adopted in 1777.

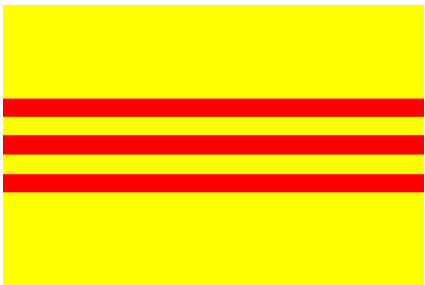
RED is for hardiness and valour

The National Flag of Free Vietnam has yellow background and three horizontal red bands in the middle of the flag.



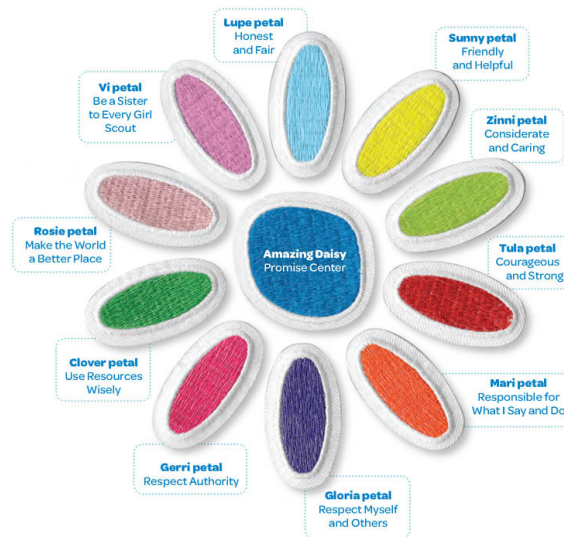
The Meaning of National Flag of Free Vietnam

My Promise, My Faith

You can earn this pin each year that you're a Daisy. You'll find that Girl Scouting and your faith have a lot in common!

Complete these five steps to earn the pin:

1. **Choose one line from the Girl Scout Law.** Find a story, song, or poem from your faith with the same ideas. Talk with your family or friends about what that line of the Law and the story, song, or poem have in common.
2. **Find a woman in your own or another faith community.** Ask her how she tries to use that line of the Law in her life.
3. **Gather three inspirational quotes** by women that fit with that line of the Girl Scout Law. Put them where you can see them every day!
4. **Make something to remind you of what you've learned.** It might be a drawing, painting, or poster. You could also make up a story or a kit.
5. **Keep the connection strong.** Talk with your friends, family, or a group in your faith community about what you've learned about your faith and Girl Scouting. Ask them to help you live the Law and your faith. Maybe you can show them what you just made or perform your skit!
